





doing so we discover that our attitude and effort are in our control. This is the essence of Habit 1 – BE PROACTIVE.

October's theme centered around Habit 2 – BEGIN WITH THE END IN MIND. We looked at the importance of knowing what you want to build, or accomplish, or just looking at creating a clear vision of the future and how it is an important step towards any future success.

Both these early themes have led right into Habit 3. We have the power to choose our attitude and effort. We can harness that power to choose to look to the future and set clear goals. And now, we can move towards understanding the importance of prioritizing our actions.

Knowing that most people have a "vision" of a happy and rewarding life it made sense to HARRY that we can now choose the 'Big Rocks' that will help reach that goal.

HARRY wants us all to know that the best way to find that inward happiness is to make **gratefulness** a habit. He wants us to avoid comparing ourselves to others as he often says that "comparison is the thief of JOY".






Tips for Holiday Stress
