

CHILL ZONE: SUPPORTING STUDENT MENTAL HEALTH

The chill zone is a safe place where students can take a break. They can come in and relax and take some time to use coping skills to get themselves regulated again so that they may return to class. It gives students a chance to re-engage and rest.




