The REACH Program Provides:

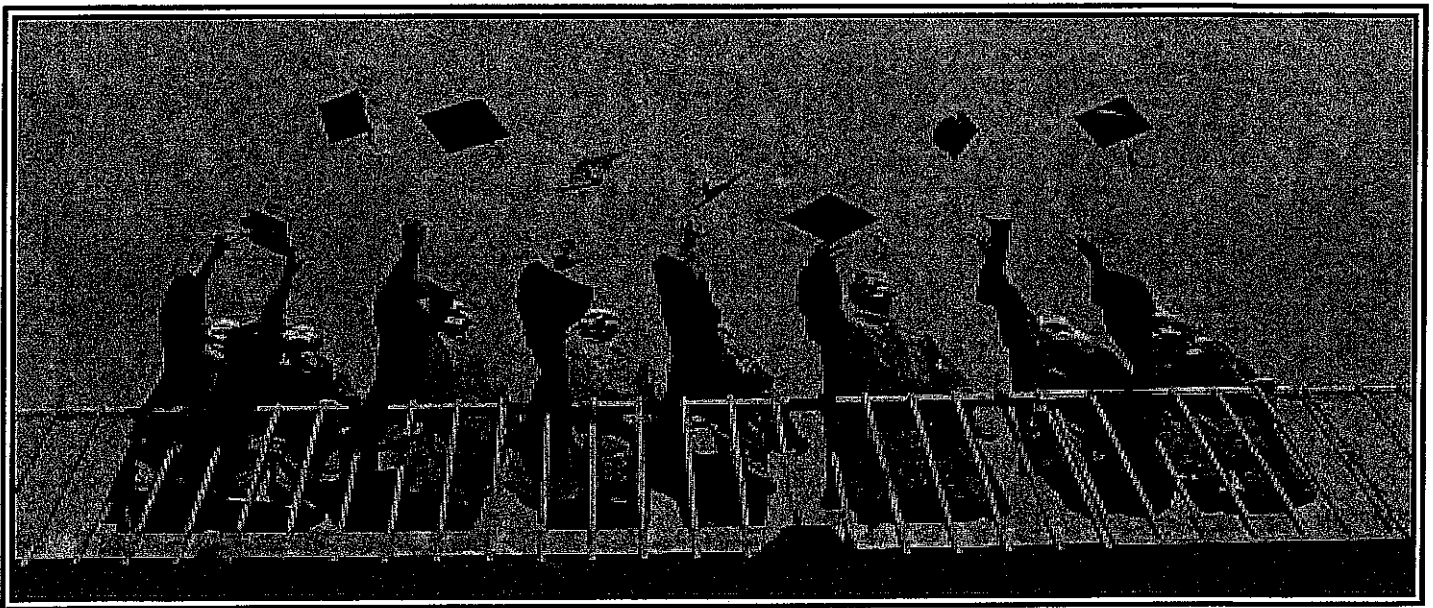
- **Relationships:** A safe place for students to belong, connect, and support each other.
