The lifelong impact of well-developed reading skills

We have had a great start to the school year, with our scholars and staff focused on learning! We continue to build on our student achievement with a new VES WIG: Viking Elementary School students will read 1,250,000 pages from October 1st to April 30th. In just the first week, our students read 37,748 pages! Mrs. Larson's 5th grade class read 10,542 pages during Week 1... that's 458 pages per student!



that 60% of students unable to name and write at least 40 letters, upper and lower case, in Kindergarten will struggle with reading in 4th grade. Being a bit of a research nerd, I reviewed our 4th grade MCA data and the letter naming data we have on those same students from Kindergarten. And, I found that 64% of our students that did not know at least 40 letter names in Kindergarten did not 'Meet' 4th grade Reading standards. So, what does this mean? It means that our teachers and families need to synergize and work with our children at a young age to talk about letters, trace and say letters, so our children are able to enter school prepared to succeed and see reading as an opportunity and enjoyment rather than a struggle and sign of failure.

While we refer often to test results, as this is how schools tend to be judged, we are talking about providing each of our children with lifelong skills helping them learn whether it be for career, development of skills or knowledge to fulfill personal needs & goals, or to be entertained by the wonderful authors of the world.

Student non-discrimination policy

Students are protected from discrimination on the basis of gender pursuant to Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 and the Minnesota Human Rights Act. A complete copy of this policy is available in on the district web site and at each school building. The Pelican Rapids School District provides equal educational opportunity for all students and prohibits discrimination on the basis of gender, parental, family and/ or marital status.

Rehabilitation Act prohibits discrimination against disabled Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, prohibits discrimination against persons with disabilities in any program receiving federal financial assistance. The Act defines a person with a disability as anyone who: 1. has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities, including learning; or 2. has a record of such impairment; or 3. is regarded as having such impairment.

Learners may be protected from disability discrimination and be eligible for services, accommodations, or programs under the provisions of Section 504 even though they are not eligible for special education pursuant to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. It is the responsibility of the school district to identify and evaluate learners who, within the intent of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, need special services, accommodations, or programs in order that such learners may receive a free appropriate public education.

7. This policy if available to parents and students upon written request to the Superintendent.

"Directory information" means information contained in an education record of a student which would not generally be considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if disclosed. It includes, but is not limited to: the student's name, enrollment status (i.e. full-time or part-time), participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, degrees, honors and awards received, and the most recent educational agency or institution attended, and photos taken in the normal course of school activities. Directory information does not include personally identifiable data which references religion, race, color, social position or nationality. Data collected from nonpublic school students, other than those who receive shared time educational services, shall not be designated as directory information unless written consent is given by the student's parent or guardian.

The school district may disclose directory information from the education records of a student without prior written consent of the parent of the student or eligible student, unless as provided herein. In order to make any or all of the directory information listed above "private" (i.e. subject to consent prior to disclosure), the parent or eligible student must make a written request to the building principal within thirty days after the date of this publication.

secondary students to military recruiting officers within 60 days after the date of the request. Should the parent of a student or eligible student so desire any or all of the listed information will not be disclosed to military recruiting officers without prior consent. In order to refuse the release of this information without prior consent the parent or eligible student must make a written request to the building principal by September 30th each vear.

Indoor Air Quality Pelican Rapids Public Schools advocate a healthy school environment in which the surroundings contribute to an environment conducive to learning for students, and productivity for teachers and staff. To help accomplish this, we have implemented an IAQ Management Plan using guidelines provided by the Minnesota Department of Education, and the "Tools for Schools" document developed by the U.S. EPA. Trevor Steeves is the IAQ Coordinator for the Pelican Rapids Public Schools. He has been trained and certified by the Minnesota Department of Education to fulfill this position. All issues concerning indoor air quality should be brought to his attention, and he can be reached by calling 218-863-5910 at the high school.

Asbestos Notification In accordance with federal regulations, Pelican Rapids Public Schools have management plans documenting the location and condition of all known or assumed asbestos containing materials (ACM) in each building. Every six months, an accredited inspector visually inspects the condition of the ACM. The high school management plan is available for public inspection at the district office during normal business hours. The elementary management plan is available for public inspection at the elementary school office during normal office hours. Trevor Steeves is the designated person responsible for maintaining the asbestos management plans for the district. He can be reached at 218-863-5910 with any questions. Pesticide Notice A state law went into effect in the 2000 that requires schools to inform parents and guardians if they apply certain pesticides on school property. The Pelican Rapids School District contracts for pest elimination. Interior work is done in January, April, July and October; exterior work is done in May and August. The pest control service provider performs the service before or after regular school hours. The district office has complete information on all pesticide products used in the buildings. Parents may review or copy this material at their own expense. If a parent or guardian wishes to be notified prior to any pesticide application made on days other than dates specified (excluding emergency applications) contact Trevor Steeves, Health and Safety Coordinator. Persons who have questions, comments, or complaints should contact their child's principal.

Release of student information

Student Records-Pelican Rapids School District No. 548 gives notice to parent of students and eligible students currently in attendance in the District of their rights regarding pupil records:

1. The right to inspect and review the student's education records; 2. The right to request the amendment of the student's education records to ensure that they are not inaccurate, misleading or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy or other rights:

3. The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that such consent is not required for disclosure pursuant to this policy, state or federal law, or the regulations promulgated thereunder;

4. The right to refuse release of secondary students' names, addresses, and home telephone numbers to military recruiting officers;

5. The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the school district to comply with the federal law and the regulations promulgated thereunder;

6. The right to be informed about rights under the federal law; and

a) The information listed above shall be public information which the school district may disclose from the education records of a student. b) Should the parent of a student or the student so desire, any or all of

the listed information will not be disclosed without the parent's or eligible student's prior written consent except to school officials as provided under federal law.

c) In order to make any or all of the directory information listed above "private" (i.e., subject to consent prior to disclosure), the parent or eligible student must make a written request to the building principal within thirty (30) days after the date of the last publication of this notice. This written request must include the following information:

(1) Name of student and parent, as appropriate; (2) Home address; (3) School presently attended by student; (4) Parent's legal relationship to student, if applicable; (5) Specific category or categories of directory information which is not to be made public without the parent's or eligible student's prior written consent.

Free, Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten program gives kids a head start

Last year, the Pelican Rapids School District was one of 74 districts in Minnesota to receive the new Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten funding. Over 200 districts, more than half of the school districts in the state, submitted applications and Pelican Rapids was awarded funding for the 2016-2017 school year.

The funding was renewed for this school year and according to Viking Elementary Principal Dr. Ed Richardson, it has become a critical service to the youngest learners. In past years, it would cost an average of \$120 per month for parents to send their kids to preschool, but **the state funding allows the district to offer the service at no charge**.

Richardson said that they look at the program as part of a continuum and getting instruction in letters, numbers, counting and simply how to operate within a school is an important hurdle for kids.

"Kids who come into kindergarten without knowing their letters and numbers can be behind by the 4th grade. Our Pre-K kids have that exposure to school and know what a school day is. They understand working with other students," said Richardson.

As coordinator, Fitzsimmons says the program

allows a smooth transition into kindergarten. Activities focus around math, literacy, art, social/play and developing fine motor skills. "Through braiding of

Voluntary Preschool, Parent Aware grants and School Readiness funding we are offering a total of 5 sections for our 3-5 year old population, a total of 74 students in age specific classes.We are a PreK-6 school," said Fitzsimmons, "not a K-6 school. We teach preschool as a grade level versus an add-on." Fitzsimmons said that the state support has allowed her to focus on teaching rather than hunting

down funding sources for the program. Richardson and Fitzsimmons both said they are pleased with the results and in the end it gives parents choice and relieves cost as a burden.

"I am pleased to be able to offer this high quality Pre-K experience for our students. Parents have the ability to choose a program that best fits the needs of their young family, as tuition no longer presents a barrier," said Fitzsimmons.

In the end, the Pelican Rapids Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten program is getting kids a head start and a leg up in school.

Fourteen PRHS students competed in a math contest at Bemidji State University on Tuesday, October 17th. The junior division was for grades 9 and 10, while 11th and 12th graders competed in the senior division.

In the senior division, Brooklyn Korvnta scored 27 out of 40 to earn second place overall out of over 300 competitors. Junior Hayden Christenson placed 13th with a 22, followed by Gavin Haugrud and Timothy Brynildson with scores of 18. Individual awards are not give separately for A & AA schools; large school Bemidji claimed seven of the top ten individuals. The Pelican Rapids senior team earned first place in the small school division, second only to Bemidji overall. This is the twelfth consecutive year that a Pelican Rapids team earned first place at this contest! Also competing well were Brandon Osborne, Haley Westby, Jacob Gottenborg, and Kaleb Tollefson. In the junior division, Logan Petznick and Alyce Erdman led the way for the Vikings with a score of 21 out of 40 to tie for 13th place. Maddie Guler was right behind them with a 19, followed closely by Kirby Nelson, Julian Gunderson, and Rachael Guler. Our junior team claimed fourth place in the small school division out of 24 schools. The average score of the junior Vikings was 18.3, while the average of all junior competitors was 12.

At sporting events we need to consider student safety and also player safety. We have had many injuries to ankles, knees, shoulders, and concussions over the years to athletes during practices and games. The last thing we ever want to see during a game is a player go down with an injury.

While the athletes are competing and doing their best during the contest, the last thing on their mind is the crowd at the game. The Leaders Gym in the Al Siegle Activity Center is a great place to play and watch a game; however, it can be very hard to keep elementary students off of the playing



surface. Our concern is that elementary students are moving around while the game is going on and there could be an injury to either the student or athlete.

Parents we need your help with these rules for students at Volleyball, Basketball, and Wrestling events.

- Elementary students must be in the bleachers while the game is go-1. ing on.
- Elementary students must go to the concession stand and bathroom 2. in between games and at half time. If a student needs to go at other times they should go with a parent for their safety.
- Elementary students can use the walking track in between games 3. and at half time, but must in the bleachers when the game is being played.
- All students must remain in the gymnasium and foyer area during 4. events. Students are not allowed to be in other areas of the building.
- All spectators must use good sportsmanship and cheer for their 5. team without putting down the opposing team.

We ask parents to help staff at sporting events by talking to elementary students about the rules and helping us enforce the rules that are in place for everyone's safety. The last thing we want is an elementary student or player injured during events.
