
Learning is a way of life, change is certain and coping strategies are a necessity. It is expected that young people graduating in the next



We are excited to start our new school year at Viking Elementary!

The addition of a fourth section in both the 1st and 2nd grades provides much smaller class sizes allowing our teachers to better serve and support our students.

Last year, our Student Lighthouse Team took on several great projects

to learn leadership skills and teamwork to better our school and community through Synergy (Habit 6) and Thinking Win-Win (Habit 5). Mrs. Neubauer will once again work with our Student Lighthouse Team which hopes take on greater responsibility as community leaders.

When you visit Viking Elementary School, you will notice our WIGs (Wildly Important Goals) and Scoreboards around the school which help our students learn to Be Proactive (Habit 1) and Begin with the End in Mind (Habit 2). Students are in the process of identifying their individual and class/grade level WIGs. Our WIGs help us to set our focus for each day, and our scoreboards help keep us accountable as we track our progress toward achieving our WIGs.

To help our students learn organization skills, our students in 3rd-6th grade have student planners which help us Put First Things First (Habit 3). We ask parents to go through their child's planner with her or him each day to review what their child did in school and what assignments are upcoming. Teachers also ask that parents initial each day when they reviewed their child's planner and the child completes his or her assignments. The planner is also a great tool for parents to ask questions of their child and to communicate with the class teacher. Our students in Kindergarten to 2nd grade will continue to use take home folders for assignments and deliver information between school and home.

As a matter of safety, we ask that parents dropping off and picking up their children from school please park at the Chauncey Martin Field (south of the school) and have children use the sidewalk near the fenced playground. This will reduce the traffic and congestion caused by busses and cars arriving through the front of the school while also providing a bit of exercise to begin and end the school day.





Progress made in each MCA area of testing

The Pelican Rapids School District made progress in each of the state required MCA areas of testing. Math increased by 1.2%, Reading increased by 2.9% and Science increased by 9.6%.

We are delighted with these results but realize we still have room to improve and will continue to work toward increased growth and success of all students.



RESOURCES AVAILABLE FOR ACADEMIC IMPROVEMENT

\$10,000 grant provides boost for blended learning intervention

The literacy-related grant was courtesy of the local Pelican Rapids Area Rotary Club and Rotary International.

READ 180 Universal is the leading blended learning intervention program building reading comprehension, academic vocabulary, and writing skills for struggling students in grades 4 and up.

Engineered to unlock the science behind reading success, READ 180 Universal incorporates the latest research on how the brain learns to read.

Students begin their journey at the **Segment Selector** where they can explore and select content that fascinates and gets them excited about reading and learning. Their cross-disciplinary experience includes science, social studies, literature, culture, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics.

Anchor videos in the **Explore Zone** activate and strengthen vocabulary and background knowledge, allowing students to comprehend and link passages to their existing knowledge. After watching the Anchor Video, students complete vocabulary-based activities that unlock meaning in the **Reading Zone** passages ahead.

The **Reading Zone** provides students with individualized texts based on their level of instruction. Students complete multiple readings of a target passage, giving



them an opportunity to build fluency, learn academic vocabulary, and practice reading comprehension strategies.

In the **Fluency Zone**, students practice spelling and reading sight words to build automaticity with word recognition, which allows their brain to focus on comprehension and retention. In the **Language Zone**, students build and expand their vocabulary knowledge through language-based activities.

In the enhanced **Writing Zone**, students practice spelling and reading sight words to build automaticity, which allows their cognitive resources to focus on comprehension and retention. The **Success Zone** allows students to build and apply fluency and comprehension strategies that they have learned and practiced in the other zones on discrepancy, context, and stretch passages.

The school district will primarily utilize this dynamic resource in grades 7-12. "This will provide additional support to high school students to increase reading skills," noted Superintendent Deb Wanek. "We are very grateful for the financial support of the Pelican Rapids Area Rotary Club and Rotary International for this valuable resource."

Funding for READ 180 was also provided by The Achievement and Integration Program.


Credit Recovery students in Grades 9-12

The smaller class size provides a positive learning environment that promotes opportunities to experience academic success. The focus is on grade level material which allows them to keep up with the rest of the students in their grade. The program also focuses

The Leader In Me[™] Program offers a challenge to our students and teachers that is very special...a private gift

The more I view the world around me, the more I am convinced that the skills and habits that are being presented to our students through the "Leader in Me" program are as important to their future success as anything we do in our school system. At the heart of the "Leader in Me" program is Stephen Covey's "Seven Habits of Effectiveness". These seven habits are rooted in a belief that each individual must take responsibility for their own lives. Introducing our students to the POWER that they have to truly transform their lives is as exciting as it is challenging.

The principles behind each habit are sound and really easy to understand. The challenge unfolds when we ask students to move away from the "easy way out"; making excuses, blaming, relying on others, etc... to comprehending how greatly they can impact their own lives with their thoughts, words and actions. The foundation habits, the ones that establish the deep roots needed to weather the storms of our life, are all geared towards not doing what is easy but instead accepting responsibility for our lives! Putting into action the first three habits is what Stephen Covey calls our "Private Victory". These first three habits are big steps in the journey towards becoming more effective.


THE PRIVATE VICTORY - Habits 1, 2 & 3

Habit 1 – Be Proactive = Author Charles Swindoll hit it out of the park when he said; "Life is 10% what happens to you and 90% how you respond to it." Our ability to choose how we feel is really the ultimate freedom we have as humans. The "easy way" is to blame others for our unhappiness or struggles - It is much more effective to work on the things we can control and establish a proactive, instead of reactive, attitude.

Habit 2 – Begin with the End in Mind = Would you start a puzzle without having a picture of the finished product? Would you head into downtown Chicago without Mapquest or Siri? Taking time to create a vision of what we would like to happen in our lives is really an effective way to take responsibility for your life. Here is where missions, goals and objectives create effectiveness. The "easy way" is to go with the flow and let others decide for you, however,

this often that leads you down the wrong roads.

Habit 3 – Put First Things First = Facebook, Twitter and Snapchat have really pushed the importance of this habit to the forefront. Habit 3 simply says, we cannot become effective in our roles in life unless we really look into what are our "Big Rocks". Big rocks are the things that are really important to us. These are the events, jobs, and people that we identify as being essential to our "End in Mind". Unless we get in the habit of prioritizing our lives, we easily spend time on the trivial aspects of life and lose opportunities to really impact the things that are really important.



I hope you can see how key this program can be by just looking at the first three habits. These principles are ways in which we can all mover towards future success. These habits are the key steps that move you from being dependent on the world around you to being independent and in charge of your life. Once we establish these roots, we will then begin to push our students to go after what is called the "Public Victory". When a person has the strong roots established by Habits 1, 2 & 3 they are mentally and emotionally ready to move from being independent to interdependent. This is a key step towards building strong and lasting relationships.

THE PUBLIC VICTORY - Habits 3, 4 & 5

Habit 4 – Think Win-Win = I have been reading a lot about leadership and how the ultimate leader is a "servant leader". This is what thinking win-win is all about. Working with others in a way that leaves people, groups, and/or organization in winning situations. The "easy" in life is to be selfish and think about only you. Your life starts to take on a whole new meaning when you work to help others achieve success.

Habit 5 – Seek First to Understand & Then to be Understood = Think about how often you sit down and really hear what a person is saying and understand what they truly want. I know in a marriage that this is one of the toughest roadblocks to happiness. Ultimately, if we are going to create strong and lasting relationships and/or partnerships it is quicker to get their by taking the time to listen and understand. Making sure another person knows we hear them and understand is powerful.

Habit 6 – Synergy = Synergy happens when your roots are strong enough to accept other's thoughts even when they go against your own. Synergy happens when you seek to create not a compromise but a truly better way to accomplish your goal(s). It is easier to go with the attitude of "my way or the highway" but ultimately you may miss the chance to travel a road that will lead to even better opportunities!

The Leader in Me program offers a challenge to our students and teachers that is very special. Like learning the basics of reading, writing and arithmetic it is a gift that each person can choose to give themselves. A gift that will continue to give their whole life. Is it easy? No. But, when you look at life, nothing that is really worthwhile is ever easy! By the way, Habit 7 surrounds the whole system with the advice to take time to recharge "you". Everyone needs to take time to re-energize themselves physically, emotionally and spiritually. Sounds easy right?

Student non-discrimination policy-

It is the responsibility of the school district to identify and evaluate learners who, within the intent of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, need special services, accommodations, or programs in order that such learners may receive a free appropriate public education. 7. This policy if available to parents and students upon written request to the Superintendent.

"Directory information" means information contained in an education record of a student which would not generally be considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if disclosed. It includes, but is not limited to: the student's name, enrollment status (i.e. full-time or part-time), participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, degrees, honors and awards received, and the most recent educational agency or institution attended, and photos taken in the normal course of school activities. Directory information does not include personally identifiable data which references religion, race, color, social position or nationality. Data collected from nonpublic school students, other than those who receive shared time educational services, shall not be designated as directory information unless written consent is given by the student's parent or guardian.

The school district may disclose directory information from the education records of a student without prior written consent of the parent of the student or eligible student, unless as provided herein. In order to make any or all of the directory information listed above "private" (i.e. subject to consent prior to disclosure), the parent or eligible student must make a written request to the building principal within thirty days after the date of this publication. secondary students to military recruiting officers within 60 days after the date of the request. Should the parent of a student or eligible student so desire any or all of the listed information will not be disclosed to military recruiting officers without prior consent. In order to refuse the release of this information without prior consent the parent or eligible student must make a written request to the building principal by September 30th each year.

Release of student information

Student Records-Pelican Rapids School District No. 548 gives notice to parent of students and eligible students currently in attendance in the District of their rights regarding pupil records:

The right to inspect and review the student's education records;

said Dawn. "I have bookshelves full-way too many! I want to find books each kid will enjoy, finding out what they like." Even

if that means checking books out of her public library, just to hear a boy ask: 'Can I get the next one?

A career in teaching had been an option in the back of Dawn's head since she was a little girl, though she wasn't quite sure that was the way to go as she headed to college.

"When I was little, I used to play school with my three brothers all the time," said Dawn. "We had a desk in the basement, and I was always the teacher."

She still remembers the names of every teacher she had at Pelican Rapids schools, and there were several that inspired her. One that she mentioned was her sixth grade teacher, Mr. Grothe. She also spoke of her high school trigonometry teacher, Mr. Polley. "He related well to us, and always had fun activities for us to do," said Dawn. "He was a good teacher, who used a little humor, and was respectful of the students." These are traits Dawn follows in the classroom.

When asked about her career. Dawn said, "I don't think of teaching as a job. It's just

something I like to do." One parent who nominated

Dawn for Teacher of the Year was thrilled with a little project she created this year to teach a life lesson. "She taught the kids how to 'pay it forward.' She sent home little cards, each time the kids do something nice for someone, they give them a card that says, "Pay it forward." So the next person can do something good for someone else. "I love that it teaches kids how to be kind, not just because they are told to, but because they want to. She plants the seed and we as parents can watch it grow into something wonderful!'

Miller joined the staff at Morris Area in 2010, after working three years as a paraeducator doing specialized interventions for students who were at risk of being placed in special education progran



Miller said he uses technology to provide differentiated instruction, working to provide students with different avenues of learning that meet their needs and skill levels.

One popular program is IXL, a math and language arts program with lessons that range from preschool to high-level calculus. When teaching students about money, Miller said he can have students work on activities that range from counting coins to making change, depending on their skill level.

Another program, Raz-Kids, offers guided online reading with interactive ebooks that can be assigned based on the student's reading level. Students can even record themselves reading for Miller to review outside of class.

The programs then provide teachers with data and tracking mechanisms they can review student work and see what help each one may still need.
