

- **Inexperienced teacher**-licensed teacher who has taught for three or fewer years
- Out-of-field teacher-licensed teacher providing instruction in an area not licensed

Goal #2: All third grade students can read at grade level



During the 2019-2020 school year, the number of 3rd grade students demonstrating proficiency by MCA and STAR will increase from 43% in Spring of 2019 to 50% in Spring of 2020.



Essential Learning Objective data and STAR Reading Assessment data was used to identify needs in this area.



1:1 iPad initiative which allows students to better interact with text and exposes our children to a wider range of text and literature.



Close reading strategies and accountable academic talk.



Monthly grade level Tier II collaboration meetings is the foundation for our targeted intervention program with our licensed intervention teachers.



Monitor success of our strategies through teacher observations, analysis of student work, and using STAR to provide growth data.

2019-20 3RD GRADE READING RESULTS



Based on STAR Reading Assessments, 3rd grade Proficiency increased from 42% to 67% from Fall to Spring in 2019-20.

Goal #4: All students are college and career ready by graduation



100% of PRHS students will participate in college and career readiness activities.

Student surveys and interviews conducted by the high school counselor were used to identify goals.

Strategies in place:

The counselor works with teachers to identify students needing support. Students are encouraged by staff and provided time to participate in activities. Progress toward our goal is monitored using participation numbers and exit surveys.
