Makerspace room for project-based learning

New this year to Viking Elementary is a makerspace room. By definition, a makerspace is a place where students can gather and tinker. This is an area dedicated to student choice and exploration based on project-based learning and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) curriculum.



A makerspace isn't just about student choice and creativity. It is an opportunity for our educational system to continue to build students who possess the following characteristics: curiosity, grit, and perseverance, all the while learning how to communicate, collaborate, and identify and solve new problems. We can give students real world problems with real world technology.

This space is being utilized by individual classrooms and grade levels as well as during monthly collaboration. Students are given the opportunity to use Legos, Marble Run, Sphero robots and Keva brain builders. Monthly STEM challenges have been performed as well, utilizing many common household supplies such as note cards, Qtips, straws, and tape to name a few. These resources allow students to freely build and problem solve.

The supplies and equipment have been acquired largely through donations. An anonymous donation allowed Viking Elementary to purchase 12 Mini Spheros which students will use coding skills to control, Legos, and consumable supplies to use during STEM challenges. Parents have also graciously donated consumables to the room. We look forward to adding more features to the room and continue to utilize the many resources it already has available.

NEW DISTRICT GOALS DEVELOPED

Last Spring the school board approved a new mission statement "Pelican Rapids Public Schools is committed to providing a variety of high quality academic, arts, and athletic programs in a unique rural setting" and vision "Pelican Rapids Public Schools prepares students to be leaders of their own future."



The committee which included administrators, staff, parents, and community members began the development of our mission and visions statement by agreeing upon a set of beliefs:

- students are our top priority.
- education is a partnership between student, family, school and community.
- our highly qualified staff provide a positive and rigorous learning environment for academic excellence.
- our diversity provides students with a unique advantage.
- our students are prepared for career, college and lifelong learning.

Based on this foundation, our school board went to work to identify their goals. Once our school board addressed a few BIG ROCKS early in the school year, including the operating levy referendum, board members used a couple of work sessions to develop four goals:



- Community Engagement
- Educate the whole child
- Increase student enrollment
- Sound and transparent financial practices

These goals will be central to our decision-making over the next few years as we develop our budgets, design our annual World's Best Workforce goals, compose our Achievement & Integration Plan for 2020-2023, review and revise curriculum, and conduct our needs assessment and annual Title One Plan.

While there can, and should, be some debate in developing goals and plans, returning to these 4 central goals along with our agreed upon mission, vision, values, and beliefs will help us with understanding one another and gaining agreement in how we prepare our students to be leaders of their own future.

Over 7,000 exceptional behavior choices at VES!

The Viking Leadership Tickets were created as a result of students in 1st grade wanting to see some type of ticket-based system for students or classes that make exceptional daily 7 Habits[®] behavior choices for the good of others and the school.

After doing a bit of math with Principal Nelson, a school-wide goal of 6,000 Viking Leadership Tickets in the months of September-January was set and the team of Rachel Haugrud, Angie Westby, Jessica Sjostrom and Pam Eiden created the ticket (shown below).



Staff member Alejandra Villagomez did a fabulous job keeping the Leadership Ticket boxes stocked.

As Viking Elementary staff noticed students or classes applying the 7 Habits[®] in their daily choices they filled out the tickets which were collected weekly. A scoreboard was kept by Principal Nelson in the front lobby so students and adults could see the progress of the school-wide goal.

On January 31st the Viking Leadership Tickets reached a grand total of 7,003! All the students were rewarded for these exceptional choices with a treat at lunch time.

A differing second goal has been made for the remainder of the 2019-20 school year...it will be fun to see what they accomplish next!


Reading is the greatest gift you can give your children

At the Pelican Rapids School district, we believe that education is a partnership between the student, family, school and community. Research shows the importance and lifelong impact of parents reading to their children and that was the driving force for the preschool book program created and administered by Community Ed and ECFE.

Sending a book to families of new babies born in the district began in the 2018-19 school year with funding provided by a United Way Caring Connections grant. A small 'Viking Pride' item (either a black and orange baby hat or a PR Vikings t-shirt) was included along with information about the FREE preschool and ECFE programs offered in the district.

This year the program has expanded to include giving a book to families of all preschoolers in the district ages 1-5. Due to budget reductions the small gift was eliminated for the babies, until recently, when a few community members volunteered to crochet black and orange hats (shown in photo below).



Research has shown that up to 90% of brain development occurs before the age of five, and that nearly half of Minnesota children enter kindergarten not fully prepared to succeed. By offering every four-year-old the opportunity to attend preschool, the state hopes to help close the achievement gap and ensure more students have a successful educational career.

Pelican Rapids offers free Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten (VPK) as one of the districts in Minnesota that has been awarded funding for the program.

Superintendent Dr. Ed Richardson said that they look at the program as part of a continuum and getting instruction in letters, numbers, counting and simply how to operate within a school is an important hurdle for kids. "Kids who come into kindergarten without knowing their letters and numbers can be behind by the 4th grade. Our Pre-K kids have that exposure to school and know what a school day is. They understand working with other students," said Richardson.

As ECFE and School Readiness Teacher/Coordinator, Terra Fitzsimmons says, "The program allows a smooth transition into kindergarten. We use Math and Language Pre-Kindergarten curriculum correlating to the K-6 models at Viking Elementary. It is integrated in an age-appropriate hands-on Pre-K experience with licensed teachers throughout the entire session. Our goal is to prepare children for success as they enter Kindergarten. Activities focus around math, literacy, art, social/play and developing fine motor skills."
