Viking Elementary School Awarded 2019-2020 Minnesota School of Excellence



This prestigious honor was awarded to Viking Elementary School for its commitment to modern teaching and learning. "Through the Minnesota School of Excellence (SOE) program, grounded in national research on high-performing schools, MESPA

has created the premier opportunity in the state for validating excellence and a commitment to continual growth in a school community," said Jon Millerhagen, MESPA Executive Director. "This school improvement program examines the entire school community through six national standards, ensuring there is a holistic approach to creating a plan for future achievement and celebrating the unique accomplishments of each School of Excellence."

Tami Staloch-Schultz, chair of the Minnesota School of Excellence Committee, said, "It takes commitment and teamwork to honestly and thoroughly assess areas of strength and at the same time identify a plan for continual growth. The SOE process asks the entire school community - parents, students, staff, administration, and more - to reflect on and celebrate the collaborative work being done in school communities. Schools that receive validation have had important data-driven conversations about what a high-quality, modern learning experience should be for all students and have plans to make that learning experience a reality for many years to come. Honoring the important work of dedicated staff, eager students, and supportive communities is an essential component of becoming a School of Excellence."

A major strength of Viking Elementary School identified by the SOE process was that its school community actively works to sustain a culture that values diverse people, ideas, perspectives and experiences. Viking Elementary School staff have been learning about trauma sensitive environments over the last 2 years. Additionally, staff have engaged with parents to learn more about the Somali culture to better understand and meet the needs of its Somali families. To support families during the initial year of our 1:1 iPad roll-out, monthly meetings provided opportunities to learn about digital citizenship and apps students are using in the classroom. The "Pastries with Parents" and "Family Tech Nights" also provide opportunities for parents to learn from students, ask questions, and share concerns & ideas.





Other strengths of Viking Elementary School highlighted by the SOE process include: Strong student and staff leadership through the Viking Leadership Team and the Student Lighthouse Team; strong belief in alignment between teaching and administrative practices and school values; and a strong teacher professional development model based on internal peer-to-peer learning and designed to help teachers better serve the needs of English language learners and lowincome student groups.

One area of improvement identified by the SOE process is in parent engagement, as participation in Viking's Parent Teacher Partnership (PTP) program has declined in recent years. To increase participation in its parent group, the PTP will be included in Title One Family Reading and Math Nights, and Viking will also promote PTP activities in its monthly Viking Family Newsletter.

"To be chosen for the Minnesota School of Excellence is a great honor for Viking Elementary School," said Derrick Nelson, Viking Elementary Principal. "This is a validation and celebration of the hard work of our teachers, staff, students, and parents of Pelican Rapids."



By offering every four-year-old the opportunity to attend preschool, the state hopes

to help close the achievement gap and ensure more students have a successful educational career.

Pelican Rapids offers free Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten (VPK) as one of the districts in Minnesota that has been awarded funding for the program.

Superintendent Dr. Ed Richardson said that they look at the program as part of a continuum and getting instruction in letters, numbers, counting and simply how to operate within a school is an important hurdle for kids.

"Kids who come into kindergarten without knowing their letters and numbers can be behind by the 4th grade. Our Pre-K kids have



that exposure to school and know what a school day is. They understand working with other students," said Richardson.

As ECFE and School Readiness Teacher/Coordinator, Terra Fitzsimmons says, "The program allows a smooth transition into

kindergarten. We use Math and Language Pre-Kindergarten curriculum correlating to the K-6 models at Viking Elementary. It is integrated in an age-appropriate hands-on Pre-K experience with licensed teachers throughout the entire session. Our goal is to prepare children for success as they enter Kindergarten. Activities focus around math, literacy, art, social/play and developing fine motor skills."



You know how teachers have favorite grade levels?




"My mom, who has very little material things herself (although she will tell you she has enough), did not hesitate. She quickly got up from her chair, went to her bedroom and

Student non-discrimination policy

Students are protected from discrimination on the basis of gender pursuant to Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 and the Minnesota Human Rights Act. A complete copy of this policy is available in on the district web site and at each school building. The Act defines a person with a disability as anyone who: 1. has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities, including learning; or 2. has a record of such impairment; or 3. is regarded as having such impairment.

Learners may be protected from disability discrimination and be eligible for services, accommodations, or programs under the provisions of Section 504 even though they are not eligible for special education pursuant to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. It is the responsibility of the school district to identify and evaluate learners who, within the intent of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, need special services, accommodations, or programs in order that such learners may receive a free appropriate public education.

Persons who have questions, comments, or complaints should contact their child's principal.

Release of student information Student Records-Pelican Rapids School District No. 548 gives notice to parent of students and eligible students currently in attendance in the District of their rights regarding pupil

- 1. The right to inspect and review the student's education records;
- The right to request the amendment of the student's education records to ensure that they are not inaccurate, misleading or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy or other rights;
- 3. The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that such consent is not required for disclosure pursuant to this policy, state or federal law, or the regulations promulgated thereunder:
- The right to refuse release of secondary students' names, addresses, and home telephone numbers to military recruiting officers;
- 5. The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged Pelican Rapids School District No. 548 hereby give notice to parents of secondary students and eligible secondary students of their rights regarding release of information

to military recruiting. The school district must release the names, addresses and home telephone numbers of secondary students to military recruiting officers within 60 days after the date of the request. Should the parent of a student or eligible student so desire any or all of the listed information will not be disclosed to military recruiting officers without prior consent. In order to refuse the release of this information without prior consent the parent or eligible student must make a written request to the building principal by September 30th each year.

Indoor Air Quality Pelican Rapids Public Schools advocate a healthy school environment in which the surroundings contribute to an environment conducive to learning for students, and productivity for teachers and staff. To help accomplish this, we have implemented an IAQ Management Plan using guidelines provided by the Minnesota Department of Education, and the "Tools for Schools" document developed by the U.S. EPA. Trevor Steeves is the IAQ Coordinator for the Pelican Rapids Public Schools. He has been trained and certified by the Minnesota Department of Education to fulfill this position. All issues concerning indoor air quality should be brought to his attention, and he can be reached.

Asbestos Notification In accordance with federal regulations, Pelican Rapids Public Schools have management plans documenting the location and condition of all known or assumed asbestos containing materials (ACM) in each building. Every six months, an accredited inspector visually inspects the condition of the ACM. The high school management plan is available for public inspection at the district office during normal business hours. The elementary management plan is available for public inspection at the elementary school office during normal office hours. Trevor Steeves is the designated person responsible for maintaining the asbestos management plans for the district. He can be reached at 218-863-5910 with any questions.

Pesticide Notice A state law went into effect in the 2000 that requires schools to inform parents and guardians if they apply certain pesticides on school property. The Pelican Rapids School District contracts for pest elimination. Interior work is done in January, April, July and October; exterior work is done in May and August. The pest control service provider performs the service before or after regular school hours. The district office has complete information on all pesticide products used in the buildings. Parents may review or copy this material at their own expense. If a parent or guardian wishes to be notified prior to any pesticide application made on days other than dates specified (excluding emergency applications) contact Trevor Steeves, Health and Safety Coordinator. A few months into a new school year and already the weeks are flying by. We are coming off of another busy summer of updates to our buildings and grounds.


