Read to Self for 20 minutes. You can read books or practice reading your sight words.	Practice writing uppercase and lowercase letters.	Write numbers from 1-120. Use different color crayons and color over the numbers you say when you count by 10s, 5s, and 2s. Count by 1's and backwards.	Eat or make a healthy snack.	Do a chore for a grown-up at your house to be helpful.
Read with an adult for 20 minutes. Ideas: snuggle up, make a fort, find a cozy place with your favorite treats!	Choose 5 sight words from the list, and write 5 sentences, using a sight word in each sentence. Located in your red folder.	Walk around your house and find items that are squares, rectangles, circles, and triangles. Draw pictures of those items (1 for each shape).	Play a game with a family member or friend.	Draw a picture to show how you can be a good friend to someone.
Cuddle up with a favorite stuffed animal, toy, or person, and read for 20 minutes.	Write about your favorite part of a snow day or things that you can do on a snow day. Be creative!	Write down two numbers and circle the number that is greater/bigger.	Build a tower out of materials that you have (blocks, boxes, books, cards).	Dance for 10 minutes to your favorite music or do some yoga.
Read 3 books and draw a picture about your favorite part or something you learned.	Write a letter to a teacher or a friend.	Gather some coins, name the coins and their values, and count them. Use pennies, nickels, and dimes.	Give a compliment to someone special. Write down what you told them.	Clean your room or an area in your home.
