


Teacher Honor Roll



Hazel Hovd

Hazel earned her bachelor's degree from Minot State University and her master's degree from University of North Dakota. She also took classes at Luther Seminary in Minneapolis and Seattle. She taught one year in Tioga, North Dakota during the oil boom, followed by two years at Dakota Lutheran Academy, which has since merged with Oak Grove. Her teaching career in Pelican Rapids began in 1960. Classes taught were World History, American History, Political Science, Reading Seminar for 10th-12th grades, and selections that she created for seniors so she could teach an "elective."

Hazel also coached declamation (speech) for 27 years.



Bob King

Bob King began his teaching career in Pelican Rapids as an Industrial Arts teacher or "Shop" as it used to be known as back in the day. Industrial Arts looked a bit different in that leathercraft taught and CAD drawings were done by paper and pencil rather than by 3-D technical programs. Small engine and diesel engine mechanics developed state and one National award honors for our school district. Electrical, welding and hands-on house construction were part of the teaching schedule for the Industrial Arts department. Bob also ran numerous study halls with his friendly demeanor and handle bar mustache.

Bob also coached junior high football and went on many scouting trips for the head coach with Phil Fauteck and John Matheson. Continuing, he and Dean Fox started the wrestling program in Pelican Rapids. They and other assistant wrestling coaches created teams that physically and eventually technically held their own and defeated local powerhouses such the Moorhead Spuds back when wrestling didn't have multiple classes for competition. Two cousins who wrestled for Bob back in the early years once stated, "While we were all learning the technical aspects of wrestling moves together and we didn't know a helluva a lot, physically, no one ever physically out wrestled us because we were in phenomenal shape and that was always something we were proud of then."

Ruth Holmgren

The oldest of seven, Ruth attended country school at Swift, Minnesota. She graduated from Warroad High School and then Bemidji State College with a K-6 Elementary degree. She taught for 35 years at Viking Elementary, retiring in 2006.

Ruth assisted with setting up the first LD programs. She taught kindergarten and sixth grade before spending 30 years enjoying third graders. Ruth was known for her huge collection of children's books, her reading bath tub, and her ability to walk the halls while correcting papers. Ruth thought Pelican Rapids would be a one-year stop, but the school and town had everything she wanted. It was a small town with a great school system in which to teach, it had diversity, and any needs not available in town could be found in a neighboring community.

Volunteering has always been an enjoyment of Ruth's. When she wasn't teaching or doing projects for others you could and will still find her volunteering at the Pass It On Store, the Public Library, Faith Church, and the Book Trailer. She promotes Little Free Libraries, Friends of the Library, Friends of Maplewood State Park, and VFW Auxiliary. Ruth enjoys this school and community where a one-year stay has become 50 years. Ruth's and Van's daughter Mollie lives in Pelican Rapids with her husband Don Deckman.



Van Holmgren

Van attended a two-room country school in Carp, Minnesota. He attended Warroad High School, graduating in 1967. Van was involved in Band, Choir, Speech, Football, Hockey, and Track in high school. He is a member of the Warroad High School Athletic Hall of Fame. He graduated from Concordia College in 1971. Superintendent Chauncey Martin hired Van to be the first Elementary Physical Education teacher and to provide afterschool activities

for grades 4-6. Van completed his D.A.P.E. certification through Mankato State and earned his Masters degree in Physical Education from Bemidji State University.

Van's teaching goals were to have fun, participate in team activities, and expose students to lifetime activity skills such as skating, sledding, running, climbing, and skiing. While teaching in Pelican Rapids he started the Pelican Rapids Special Olympics program, assisted with the Pelican Rapids Lions "Coats for Kids & Adults", and was active with the Pelican Rapids Education Association.

Van retired in 2006 and has enjoyed substituting and volunteering at Viking Elementary and the high school, traveling, visiting family and friends, exploring all 73 State Parks, riding bike trails throughout "outstate Minnesota", touring all 23 Scenic By-Ways of Minnesota, and volunteering in the community with OAKS, Maplewood State Park, City Park Board, and Bike Repair Team. 


