First, members of the Pelican Rapids School Foundation and Viking GALA committee would like to thank you for attending! Without your ticket purchase, this event would not be taking place!



Al Grothe



Al Grothe 1964-2004

Al Grothe grew up in Fort Ransom North Dakota, a village of approximately 200 people. Al attended school there and graduated in 1960 with a class of 7. To say that they were given a basic education would be an understatement. After high school, Al attended Valley City State College and graduated in 1964 with majors in English and Elementary Education. That same fall, Al signed a contract to teach in Pelican Rapids. Al was planning to teach for a couple of years to pay some bills and then go back to school. As you know, it didn't turn out that way.

During his first year of teaching, he was placed in a Sixth-Grade classroom with 38 students. Classrooms were completely self-contained that year and had very little help. Classroom teachers taught everything, had no prep period and shared playground duty. It was an interesting introduction. Al was also informed that he would be the advisor for the school patrol. Al was the guy that students went to when some student broke the rules. In Al's second year, a new teacher signed on and the teacher he had worked with moved away. Classes were divided at that time, so the school no longer had a self-contained classroom. That year it was discovered that very few students had ever seen the State Capitol, so a decision was made to start the Sixth-grade trip to the cities.

A couple of years into his career, Al was asked to take over as Scoutmaster for Troop 313. He worked with scouts, in various capacities, for 30 years.

It is amazing how fast time goes. Al married a local girl, Sandra Laugen and raised 4 children, Jennifer, Rebecca, Catherine, and Theodore. All of them graduated from Pelican Rapids High School. His family joined Faith Lutheran Church where they are still active. After 40 years in the classroom, Al retired but was asked to serve as a Lay Pastor. He spent one year at Central Lutheran Church as an interim Pastor and another eight and a half years as a visitation Pastor at Trinity Lutheran Church.

Al never intended to stay in Pelican Rapids, but he can honestly say that he doesn't ever regret his decisions. Pelican Rapids and School District 548 are wonderful, and Al still loves it here!

John McMillen grew up in Casselton, North Dakota. He was born in Moorhead, Minnesota December 24, 1945. He graduated from Casselton High School in 1967. He enrolled at Valley City State University that fall and was graduated in 1967 with a BS degree in Elementary Education. That summer he married Joan Ellen Marshall and both of them got teaching jobs in Great Falls, Montana. They taught there two years and he wanted to go back to school. John selected Moorhead State and was lucky to get a job in Pelican Rapids.

Mike Douglas attended Dilworth K-12 and graduated in 1970. He went to Moorhead State for a year and one quarter then was drafted into the Army for two years. After leaving the Army, he attended three more years at MSU and graduated in 1976.

Mike applied to 100 Minnesota schools for a job and couldn't even get an interview. He was advised to try North Dakota because Minnesota schools only interviewed you if you had teaching experience. Mike applied to nine schools in North Dakota and seven of them offered him a job. He took the job In Oakes, ND and taught social studies and coached three sports there for two years. He applied for a job in Pelican Rapids and was hired in 1978. Mike came back to Minnesota from Oakes along with four other Minnesota native teachers after they got their teaching experience in Oakes. He taught Earth Science and Geography at first. Then Mike taught Senior Economics and 8th grade Geography for the next 29-30 years. Mike coached Junior High football for 31 years, basketball, and track for 17 years straight. Mike retired in 2010 and has been a substitute teacher since 2010. Mike is happy to live in Pelican Rapids. In his 32 years of teaching in Pelican Rapids, Mike never once wished he was in a different school. GO VIKINGS !!!


