- Our District COVID-19 Team meets weekly to review COVID-19 trends in our district and community. At this time we have determined that we will continue with our current Learning Models.
- We encourage students, families and staff to be prepared for Learning Model changes as COVID-19 numbers fluctuate. We will continue to post updates on our website and Facebook pages and via Skylert.
- Due to the rise of active cases in our community, we encourage household gatherings during Fall break to include immediate family members only and ask that you take extra precautions if you have out-of-area family returning home.
- All staff and students who chose not to adhere to Governor Walz's mandate are asked to do distance learning for 14 days after the gathering. Governor Walz's Emergency Executive Order 20-96: 10-person limit for indoor and outdoor gatherings, and limited to members of three households or less.
